## BCER Sullivan Station replicated; original to be restored & protected

As a result of consultation with heritage restoration experts, the FVHRS Board has decided to restore the original Sullivan Station and relocate where it will be sheltered while replicating the 1909 structure for use with the Society's heritage interurban system planned for partial operation in 2006. The replicated station and the restored Sullivan Station projects are funded by the Real Estate Foundation of B.C., Polygon Homes Ltd., Scotiabank and a donation-in-kind from the Lark Group.

The replicated station was a 'design / build' with the Lark Group which subcontracted the carpentry above the deck level to Brent McIvor and Pidoca Construction, high-end custom-home builders that have a special interest in heritage projects. The Lark Group co-ordinated the project and designed and constructed the structural sub-floor under the station so that it can be lifted in one piece by a crane and relocated. The modular platform can be taken apart in sections for relocation. The balustrade adjacent to the rail line is modular so it can be removed when the rail line is in place.

*Five directors are to be elected. Nomination forms are to be sent to Nominations Chair Graham MacDonell.*




## SULLIVAN & FVHRS STORYBOARDS UNVEILINGS
