NOW WE ARE FOUR! BCER 1231 COMES TO CLOVERDALE

At the FVHRS Annual General Meeting, Director Hugh Parkinson, announced that we have acquired Car 1231, sister car of 1225. 1231 has been stored in the False Creek carbarn of the now defunct Downtown Heritge Rail operation in Vancouver.

Hugh was the lead director during the lengthy acquisition process.

In January 2016, the companion car to 1231 in the DHR, 1207, was donated to the FVHRS by its Seattle owner, Byron Cole. Hugh was instrumental in conducting that acquisition as well.

As we approach the completion of the 5 year restoration of 1304, we are planning a grand celebration as Car 1304 is returned to service on the Fraser Valley Line.

1304 was the interurban car used to carry Prince Arthur, third son of Queen Victoria, the Duke of Connaught and the Governor General of Canada, when he toured the B.C. Lower Mainland in 1912. It was named the "Connaught" car from then on. The re-launch of the 105 year old Interurban, the only surviving "Chilliwack" car, will mark the return of 1304 the "Connaught" to (heritage) passenger service, on the line it was built for. We are planning a big party with dignitaries, very special guests and a few surprises! And you are all invited!

The BCER 1304 Restoration Project \$620,000

- The Province of BC awarded \$50,000 toward refurbishing 1304's trucks.
- The BC Museums Association awarded \$50,000 toward refurbishing 1304's trucks as part of the BC/Canada 150 programme.
- FVHRS volunteer work to restore the car body, electrical system and trucks (16,000 hours over 5 years) value \$ 480,000
- FVHRS members donated \$25,000 to the Canada 150 Connaught restoration legacy project, and \$15,000 toward restoration of the 1304 seats.

Track expansion & connection project \$120,000

To launch BCER 1304 from the carbarn a new 150-foot long connecting track and switch is required. PNR Railworks, Southern Railway of BC, and Mainland Sand & Gravel are donating the material labour necessary as their Canada 150 legacy project, to facilitate the launch of 1304. Twenty PNR employees agreed to donate their personal time over a 5-week period to lay the new connecting track.







Carbarn expansion project \$190,000

- The City of Surrey awarded \$150,000 toward the carbarn expansion to house BCER 1304, its generator and the trackmobile.
- RDM Enterprises Group: gave excavation and backfill services.
- RJP Contracting donation toward foundation formwork.
- FVHRS exterior and interior finishes to building.

Construction of the barn expansion should be complete by the end of July.


